CAREER OPPORTUNITIES AND RELATED OCCUPATIONS: Graduates from this program are qualified to teach P.E. at the high school level, work in an industry that has a physical fitness program—YMCA, YWCA, Jewish Centers—research, dean's work, physical fitness program, or recreational directors.

EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS: An additional year beyond the B.S. degree is needed to obtain credentials. Graduate training is needed for college teaching.

JOB OUTLOOK: Employment of coaches and related workers is expected to increase faster than the average for all occupations through the year 2014. Employment will grow as the general public continues to participate in organized sports for entertainment, recreation, and physical conditioning.

ENTERING SALARY: In 2008, the average entering salaries for credentialed teachers in the Inland Empire begin at **\$39,618**. Those with a Master's degree and more experience average about **\$70,000** a year.
